_____ **REQUEST FOR ADMISSION**
for Admission to the Practice of Law **WITHOUT EXAMINATION**
Without Examination

I hereby make application for admission to the practice of law in Ohio without examination. In conformity with Section 10 of Rule I of the Supreme Court Rules for the Government of the Bar, I am submitting the following (check each item being submitted):

- (1) certificates of good standing from all jurisdictions in which I am admitted, dated no earlier than 60 days prior to submission of the application;
- (2) a Certificate of Presentation;
- (3) an official transcript, evidencing that I have earned a bachelor’s degree (PDF transcripts cannot be used);
- (4) an official transcript, evidencing that I have earned a law degree from an ABA-approved law school (PDF transcripts cannot be used);
- (5) a fingerprint identification card;
- (6) an executed Affidavit of Applicant as required under Sec. 10, Division (C)(1);
- (7) an executed Affidavit of Past Practice as required under Section 10, Division (C)(3);
- (8) an executed Affidavit (or affidavits) as required under Section 10, Division (C)(4);
- (9) a completed single-sided Applicant’s Questionnaire and Acknowledgement of Complete Application, typed and properly executed, **and** a copy of the Questionnaire and Acknowledgement;
- (10) two original, separately executed General Authorization and Release forms (7A);
- (11) one original, separately executed NCBE Authorization and Release form (7D);
- (12) a non-refundable fee in the amount of \$1,500 by **certified check or money order** made payable to the Supreme Court of Ohio;
- (13) the Payment Confirmation Form from the National Conference of Bar Examiners (“NCBE”) and if applicable, a non-refundable fee by **check** made payable to the NCBE, in the appropriate amount as indicated on the NCBE fee schedule; and
- (14) if applicable, a complete Application for Certification to Practice Pending Admission with the appropriate supporting documents.

I have read Rule I of the Supreme Court Rules for the Government of the Bar, which pertains to admission to the practice of law in Ohio and sets forth the procedures to which I am subject. I understand that, before being approved for admission without examination, I must satisfy the Court that I currently possess the legal skills deemed adequate for admission to the practice of law in Ohio without examination, and I must be approved as to character, fitness, and moral qualifications to practice.
