


JFA Institutes Findings of the L.A. Jail Population (2011)




Total: inmate population as of December 2011.

Sentenced: inmates who are already sentenced for a crime and/or doing time for that crime.

Sentenced with Pending Charge: inmates who have been sentenced on one or more charges and have at least one pending charge.

Pretrial: inmates who have pending charges and no sentenced matters (pretrial Inmates).

Further Breakdown of Pretrial Inmates



Pretrial Inmates: inmates as identified in the study as the "total pretrial population."

Sentenced to another crime: see "Sentenced" above (i.e., not eligible for any type of pretrial release).

Outstanding Warrants: inmate has an outstanding warrant (i.e., not eligible for any type of pretrial release).

"No Bails": inmates who have a no bail hold or do not have bail set (i.e., not eligible for any type of pretrial release).

Assaultive Crimes: inmates who are accused of a crime involving assault that prohibits pretrial (i.e., not eligible for any type of pretrial release).

Maximum/High Security: inmates assigned with a maximum or high security status (i.e., not eligible for any type of pretrial release).

Remainder: pretrial inmates remaining after the above categories (sentenced, warrants, no bails, assault etc.) have been subtracted out. These inmates have a bail set, do not have outstanding warrants, have not been sentenced on another crime, are not accused of an assault crime and are not under maximum of high security. This makes them ostensibly eligible for some form of pretrial release. Some of these inmates may still be in custody due to advice of counsel for time served or other reasons.
