Foreclosure Mediation Training

Co-sponsored by: Cuyahoga County Court of Common Pleas

Foreclosure Mediation (Basic Mediation is a pre-requisite for Mediators)

Course Description: This training course will provide participants with a thorough knowledge of the range of both retention and liquidation settlement options, including, HAMP, Save the Dream resources, short sale, deed-in-lieu, and internal modifications. Participants will also discuss the limitations of foreclosure mediation, advantages and disadvantages for the parties in foreclosure cases and the information required from the parties to come to an agreement under each option. They also will analyze the relationship between pro se homeowners and lenders in foreclosure cases while also identifying when and how to terminate the mediation. During this training course, participants will discuss the history of and institutional changes that led to the foreclosure crisis, the importance and scope of the task at hand, learn the relevant terminology, players and the inter/intra party dynamics of the foreclosure servicing industry that will inform and limit settlement possibilities in home foreclosure and loan default situations. Finally, participants will review relevant statutes and rules in order to recognize the legal framework applying to foreclosure cases and learn how to apply the local court foreclosure mediation program processes and procedures. Participants will become familiar with the Supreme Court Foreclosure Mediation Program Model.

The Uniform Mediation Act: The Role of Professionals in Mediation

The Uniform Mediation Act (UMA) was adopted in Ohio on October 29, 2005. This training aims to familiarize participants of the Act's provisions, including the scope of the Act, specific privileges and exceptions, confidentiality, the role of party and non-party participants and clients' rights.

Who Should Attend

Professionals working with any local court in the State of Ohio interested in foreclosure mediation. For those interested in doing foreclosure mediation, a minimum of 12 hours of basic mediation training is required.
