### MOTION AND PROCEDURAL RULINGS

**2000-1030. Ohio Hosp. Assn. v. Armstrong World Industries, Inc.**

Cuyahoga App. No. 76067. This cause is pending before the court as an appeal from the Court of Appeals for Cuyahoga County. On April 13, 2001, this court stayed further proceedings in this case and ordered appellee to file a notice with this court upon the termination of the automatic stay under the Bankruptcy Code.

IT IS ORDERED by the court, sua sponte, that appellee W. R. Grace & Son & Co.-Conn. file a notice advising this court of the status of the bankruptcy case within 15 days of the date of this entry.

**2004-0885. Crittenden Ct. Apt. Assoc. Ltd. v. Cuyahoga Cty. Bd. of Revision.**

Board of Tax Appeals, Nos. 2003-M-595, 2003-M-596 and 2003-M-597. This cause is pending before the court as an appeal from the Board of Tax Appeals. Upon consideration of appellant's motion for extension of time to file appellant's merit brief pursuant to S.Ct.Prac.R. XIV(6)(C),

IT IS ORDERED by the court that the motion for extension of time be, and hereby is, granted, and appellant's merit brief is due on or before August 2, 2004.

### DISCIPLINARY CASES

**2002-2149. Stark Cty. Bar Assn. v. Hare.**

IT IS ORDERED by this court, sua sponte, that David B. Hare, Attorney Registration No. 41217, last known business address in Medina, Ohio, is found in contempt for failure to comply with this court's order of July 23, 2003, to wit:

failure to pay board costs on or before October 21, 2003, and failure to pay publication costs on or before June 16, 2004.

**2004-0926. Disciplinary Counsel v. Jewett.**

On July 8, 2004, respondent filed a motion to compel the Supreme Court to comply with the Civil Rules of Procedure of the state of Ohio. Whereas the show cause order issued by the court on June 15, 2004, stated that all documents filed in this case shall meet the filing requirements set forth in the Rules of Practice of the Supreme Court.

IT IS ORDERED by the court that the motion is denied.
