{¶1} The applicant filed a reparations application seeking reimbursement of expenses incurred with respect to an October 17, 2002 assault incident. On February 19, 2004, the Attorney General denied the applicant's claim pursuant to R.C. 2743.60(E) since the applicant was convicted of three counts of felony Non-support of Dependents on June 3, 2002, which is within ten years of the criminally injurious conduct. On March 18, 2004, the applicant filed a request for reconsideration. On April 6, 2004, the Attorney General denied the claim once again pursuant to R.C. 2743.60(E). On April 26, 2004, the applicant filed a notice of appeal to the Attorney General's April 6, 2004 Final Decision. Hence, this matter came to be heard before this panel of three commissioners on July 21, 2004 at 1:10 P.M.

{¶ 2} Neither the applicant nor anyone on his behalf appeared at the hearing. A certified legal intern, under the supervision of an Assistant Attorney General, attended the hearing, summarized the case, and reiterated the Attorney General's position for denial of the claim. After a brief discussion of the claim, the panel chairman concluded the hearing.

From review of the file and with full and careful consideration given to all the information presented at the hearing, we find that the April 6, 2004 decision of the Attorney General shall be affirmed pursuant to R.C. 2743.60(E).

## IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED THAT

- 1) The April 6, 2004 decision of the Attorney General is AFFIRMED;
- 2) This claim is DENIED and judgment is rendered in favor of the state of Ohio;
- 3) Costs are assumed by the court of claims victims of crime fund.
