The applicant filed a reparations application seeking reimbursement of expenses incurred with respect to a January 29, 2006 assault and robbery incident. On April 13, 2006, the Attorney General denied the applicant's claim pursuant to R.C. 2743.60(E) since there was sufficient evidence that the victim, at the time of the criminally injurious conduct, engaged in a felony violation of R.C. 2925.11, possession of drugs. On June 5, 2006, the Attorney General determined that the previous decision warranted no modification. On June 22, 2006, the applicant filed a notice of appeal to the Attorney General's June 5, 2006 Final Decision. On September 21, 2006 at 10:30 A.M., this matter came to be heard before this panel of three commissioners.

**{¶2}** Neither the applicant nor anyone on his behalf appeared at the hearing. An Assistant Attorney General attended the hearing, presented exhibits, and reiterated her position for denying the claim. After a brief discussion of the matter, the panel chairman concluded the hearing.

**{¶3}** From review of the file and with full and careful consideration given to all the information presented at the hearing, we find the June 5, 2006 decision of the Attorney General shall be affirmed.

## IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED THAT

- 1) The June 5, 2006 decision of the Attorney General is AFFIRMED;
- 2) This claim is DENIED and judgment is rendered for the state of Ohio;
- 3) Costs are assumed by the court of claims victims of crime fund.
