Judicial family life is unique as judges and their families live their private lives in the public eye.

The Supreme Court of Ohio Advisory Committee on the Judicial Family Network is dedicated to providing information and education on topics of concern and importance to judicial households and their extended family members.

The advisory committee exists to identify the needs and concerns of judicial families in Ohio and to offer a supportive network and educational opportunities to spouses, partners, and children of judges. The committee develops and presents programs to address issues judicial families may encounter and offers strategies for responding to the issues.

The committee provides opportunities for spouses and partners of judges to meet and interact with one another in order to foster informal networks of support and communication. Among current areas of interest to judicial families are social media and online presence, trauma-informed care, home and travel security, ethics guidelines, judicial elections, and quality-of-life issues.
