5 **RULE 37. STATISTICAL REPORTS AND INFORMATION.**

6
7 **(A) Submission of reports**

8
9 The judges of a court shall submit to the Case Management Section of the Supreme Court
10 in electronic format via the Supreme Court website reports as required by Sup.R. 37.01
11 through 37.03. The reporting judge, administrative judge, and preparer, if other than the
12 reporting judge, shall be deemed to have attested to the accuracy of the report. The reports
13 shall be as prescribed by the ~~manager~~ case management section and submitted no later than
14 the fifteenth day after the close of the reporting period.

16 **(B) Website Credentials**

17
18 The administrative judge of each court of appeals, court or division of a court of common
19 pleas, municipal court, or county court shall take steps necessary to ensure the security of
20 the Supreme Court website login credentials.

23 **RULE 37.01. COURTS OF APPEALS REPORTS.**

25 **(A) Presiding judge reports Appellate Caseflow Report**

26
27 The administrative judge of a court of appeals shall prepare and submit a quarterly
28 “Appellate Caseflow Report”, formerly known as “Presiding Judge Report”, in compliance
29 with Sup.R. 37.

31 **(B) ~~Judge reports~~ Panel Disposition Report**

33 ~~Each~~ The administrative judge of a court of appeals shall prepare and submit a quarterly
34 “Panel Disposition Report”, formerly known as the “Appellate Judge Report”, which shall
35 be submitted through the ~~presiding or~~ administrative judge in compliance with Sup.R. 37.

38 **RULE 37.02. COURTS OF COMMON PLEAS REPORTS.**

40 **(A) Judge reports**

41
42 Each judge of a general, domestic relations, probate, or juvenile division of a court of
43 common pleas shall prepare and submit a monthly statistical report in compliance with
44 Sup.R. 37. ~~Each judge of a probate division of a court of common pleas shall prepare and~~
45 submit a quarterly statistical report in compliance with Sup.R. 37.

47 **(B) Assigned judge reports**

48
49 Each judge temporarily assigned to a court of common pleas by the Chief Justice of the
50 Supreme Court and each judge of a court of common pleas temporarily assigned to another
51 division of the court by the presiding judge of the court shall prepare and submit a monthly
52 statistical report. The reports shall be submitted to the judge for whom the assigned judge
53 is sitting and included in that judge’s report to the Case Management Section of the
54 Supreme Court submitted by the administrative judge of the division in compliance with
55 Sup.R. 37.

58 **RULE 37.03. MUNICIPAL AND COUNTY COURT REPORTS.**

60 **(A) ~~Administrative judge reports~~ Unassigned Cases/Particular Session Report**

62 Each administrative judge of a municipal or county court shall prepare and submit a
63 monthly ~~“Administrative Judge Report”~~ “Unassigned Cases/Particular Session Report” in
64 compliance with Sup.R. 37.

66 **(B) ~~Individual judge reports~~ Assigned Cases Report**

67
68 Each judge of a municipal or county court shall prepare and submit a monthly ~~“Individual
69 Judge Report”~~ “Assigned Cases Report” in compliance with Sup.R. 37.

70
71 **(C) Assigned judge reports**

72
73 Each judge temporarily assigned to a municipal or county court by the Chief Justice of the
74 Supreme Court and each judge of a municipal or county court temporarily assigned to
75 another division of the court by the presiding judge of the court shall prepare and submit a
76 monthly statistical report. The report shall be submitted to the judge for whom the assigned
77 judge is sitting and included in that judge’s report to the Case Management Section of the
78 Supreme Court submitted by the administrative judge of the division in compliance with
79 Sup.R. 37.

84 **RULE 37.04. REPORTING STANDARDS.**

86 The following standards shall apply in completing the statistical reports required by Sup.R. 37.01
87 through 37.03:

89 (A) In domestic relations cases, motions filed prior or subsequent to a final decree of
90 divorce or dissolution shall be considered part of the original case and reported under the
91 original case number;

92

93 (B) A motion filed in delinquency and unruly cases shall be considered part of the case
94 in which the motion is filed, unless the motion is considered a separate delinquency case
95 under R.C. 2151.02(B);

96
97 (C) A criminal case and a traffic case arising from the same act, transaction, or series
98 of acts or transactions shall be considered separate cases.

110 **(B) Criminal case time limits.**
111

112 **(1) General.** In common pleas court, ninety-five percent of all criminal cases shall be
113 tried within nine months (270 days) of the date of arraignment on an indictment or information.
114 In municipal and county court, all criminal cases shall be tried within the time provided in R.C.
115 Chapter 2945. Whenever a hearing or trial time is extended or shortened pursuant to R.C. 2945.72
116 or Crim.R. 5 or 45, the judge shall state the reason for the change in an order and journalize the
117 order.

118
119 **(2) Grand jury proceedings.** When an accused has been bound over to a grand jury
120 and no final action is taken by the grand jury within sixty days after the date of the bindover, the
121 administrative judge of the court or division of the court shall dismiss the charge unless for good
122 cause shown the prosecuting attorney is granted a continuance for a definite period of time.
123

124 **(3) Felony preliminary hearing.** ~~A preliminary hearing in a felony case shall be held~~
125 ~~within two months of the date of arrest or the date of issuance of the summons in ninety-five~~
126 ~~percent of felony cases.~~
127

128 **(4)(3) Sentencing.** Provided the defendant in a criminal case is available, the court shall
129 impose sentence or hold a sentencing hearing with all parties present within fifteen days of the
130 verdict or finding of guilt or receipt of a completed pre-sentence investigation report. Any failure
131 to meet this time standard shall be reported to the administrative judge, who shall take the
132 necessary corrective action. In a single judge division, the failure shall be reported by the judge
133 to the Case Management Section, which shall refer the matter to the Chief Justice of the Supreme
134 Court for corrective action.
135

136 **(5)(4) Post-conviction relief petitions; death penalty cases.** All post-conviction relief
137 petitions filed in death penalty cases shall be ruled upon within one hundred eighty days of the
138 date of filing. In any month where a post-conviction relief petition in a death penalty case is filed,
139 pending, or terminated, the administrative judge shall submit the Post-Conviction Relief Petition
140 Report detailing the status of the petition.
141

142 **(C) Reporting.** Any failure to comply with the time limits specified in this rule, and
143 the reason for the failure, shall be reported immediately to the administrative judge, who shall take
144 the necessary corrective action. In a single-judge court or division, the failure shall be reported by
145 the judge to the Case Management Section. The Case Management Section shall report to the
146 Chief Justice, who may take such action as may be necessary to cause the delinquent case to be
147 tried forthwith.
148

149 **(D) Dismissal and refiling of cases.** A judge shall not order, instruct, or otherwise
150 direct, suggest, encourage, or request a party or attorney to dismiss and subsequently refile a case
151 in order to avoid failure by the judge to comply with the time limits specified in this rule.
152

156 **RULE 42. ~~Complex Litigation~~ Case Determination--Court of Common Pleas.**

157
158 (A) **Complex litigation civil case determination.** An attorney representing a party to
159 ~~an a civil~~ action filed in the general division of the court of common pleas or a case designated as
160 a Civil Action on the probate statistical report used in the probate division of the court of common
161 pleas may request that the case be designated as complex litigation. The attorney filing the request
162 shall certify that the attorney has approval from his or her client to file the request. In determining
163 whether a case shall be designated as complex litigation, the judge to whom the case is assigned
164 shall consider all of the following:

- 166 (1) Number of parties involved;
 - 167
 - 168 (2) Whether a class action is involved (applicable to common pleas general division
169 only);
 - 170
 - 171 (3) Whether it is a products liability case (applicable to common pleas general division
172 only);
 - 173
 - 174 (4) Whether there are other related cases involving unusual multiplicity or complexity
175 of factual or legal issues;
 - 176
 - 177 (5) Extent of discovery necessary to prepare the case for trial;
 - 178
 - 179 (6) Number or availability of parties and witnesses for trial;
 - 180
 - 181 (7) Any endorsement of or objections to the request from an opposing party or counsel
182 for an opposing party.

183

184 (B) **Complex criminal case determination.** A party to a criminal action filed in the
185 general division of the court of common pleas may move the court to designate the case as
186 complex. Notice shall be provided to the parties and any victims for the opportunity to object. If
187 an objection is made, the judge shall decide if additional information is required to determine the
188 issue and hold a hearing. In determining whether a case shall be designated as complex, the judge
189 to whom the case is assigned shall consider all the following:

- 191 (1) Number of co-defendants;
 - 192
 - 193 (2) Number of victims;
 - 194
 - 195 (3) Whether there are other related cases involving unusually complicated factual or
196 legal issues;
 - 197
 - 198 (4) Defendant is subject to a potential life sentence;
 - 199
 - 200 (5) Number or availability of necessary parties or witnesses;
- 201

202 (6) Extent of discovery necessary to prepare the case for trial;

203
204 (7) Defendant pleads NGRI and/or competency is raised;

205
206 (8) Any endorsement of or objections to the request from a victim, opposing party or
207 counsel for an opposing party;

208
209 (9) Whether a defendant has waived his or her right to a speedy trial;

210
211 (10) Any other unusual facts, circumstances, or complicated legal issues.

212
213 **(C) Complex litigation case determination--judicial.** The judge to whom the case is
214 assigned may designate a case as complex litigation without a request from an attorney
215 representing a party to the action. The designation shall be made after the judge considers the
216 factors set forth in divisions (A)(1) to (7) or (B) of this rule. The judge's decision as to whether
217 the case shall be designated complex is not a final appealable order.

218
219 **(D) Speedy trial.** Nothing in this rule shall be held to supersede or affect the statutorily
220 mandated limits contained in R.C. 2945.71.

221
222 **(E) Time; reporting Supreme Court time guideline reporting.** A Pursuant to Sup.R.
223 39, a designation of a case as complex litigation pursuant to division (A) or (B) of this rule shall
224 be made within six eighteen months (540 days) of the date on which the case was filed. A
225 designation of a criminal case as complex pursuant to division (B) of this rule shall be made within
226 4 months (120) days of the date on which the defendant was arraigned. If a case is designated as
227 complex litigation, the judge shall submit to the Case Management Section of the Supreme Court
228 a report specifying the reasons for the designation of the case as complex litigation. The judge
229 shall include the case in the statistical report submitted pursuant to Sup.R. 37.02(A) under the
230 category of complex litigation criminal or complex civil in the general division of the court of
231 common pleas or complex civil in the probate division of the court of common pleas. For complex
232 civil cases in the general division and complex civil cases in the probate division of the court of
233 common pleas, The the judge shall have thirty-six months (1,095 days) from the date of filing to
234 terminate the case. For complex criminal cases, the judge shall have 12 months (365 days) from
235 the date of arraignment to terminate the case.

236
237 **(D) Authority of the Chief Justice.** ~~The Case Management Section shall periodically~~
238 ~~report the designation of cases as complex litigation to the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court,~~
239 ~~who may decide that a case should not be classified as complex litigation. If the Chief Justice~~
240 ~~determines that a case should not be classified as complex litigation, the Case Management Section~~
241 ~~shall notify the judge who shall remove the case from the complex litigation docket and notify the~~
242 ~~parties.~~
