This Temporary Administrative Entry and Order is made upon this Court's own motion, and for good cause shown, in the interest of the health, welfare, and safety of the general public, and of this Court's employees. Administrative Judge Beth W. Cappelli, makes the following findings of fact:

WHEREAS, on January 31, 2020, Health and Human Services Secretary, Alex M. Azar II, declared a public health emergency for the United States to aid the nation's healthcare community in responding to COVID-19; and

WHEREAS, on March 9, 2020, Governor Mike DeWine declared a State of Emergency in Executive Order 2020-01D; and

WHEREAS, in addition to a series of Executive Orders, the Director of Health has issued a series of special orders under Ohio Revised Code 3701.13 to prevent the spread of COVID-19 and to protect life, health, and welfare of Ohioans; and

WHEREAS, on April 30, 2020, the Ohio Department of Health Director signed the Director's Stay Safe Ohio Order that reopened businesses, with exceptions; and

WHEREAS, COVID-19 is an unprecedented and continuously evolving threat facing Ohio, and the health and safety of the public remains a top priority.

Now therefore, the Fairborn Municipal Court's Local Rules may continue to be temporarily modified to allow the Court flexibility, within Constitutional limits, in response to the public health emergency and to maintain the essential operations and functions of the Court. To further the goal of physical distancing and reducing traffic within the courthouse, the Court is therefore temporarily suspending the Traffic Intervention Program 'TIP' until further notice.
