**REQUEST FOR MILITARY
SPOUSE ADMISSION**

I hereby make application for military spouse admission to practice law in Ohio. In conformity with Gov. Bar Rule I, Sec. 18 of the Supreme Court Rules for the Government of the Bar, I am submitting the following (check each item being submitted):

- (1) certificates of good standing from all jurisdictions in which I am admitted, dated no earlier than 60 days prior to submission of the application;
- (2) a Certificate of Admission, evidencing that I took and passed a bar exam;
- (3) an official transcript, evidencing that I have earned a bachelor's degree (PDF transcripts sent to transcripts@sc.ohio.gov);
- (4) an official transcript, evidencing that I have earned a law degree from an ABA-approved law school (PDF transcripts sent to transcripts@sc.ohio.gov);
- (5) an executed Affidavit of Applicant;
- (6) a copy of my spouse's Military Orders;
- (7) a completed single-sided Applicant's Questionnaire and an original Acknowledgment of Complete Application, typed and properly executed;
- (8) two original, separately executed General Authorization and Release forms (7A);
- (9) one original, signed and dated NCBE Authorization and Release form (7D);
- (10) a non-refundable fee in the amount of \$75 by **certified check or money order** made payable to the Supreme Court of Ohio; and
- (11) the Payment Confirmation Form from the National Conference of Bar Examiners ("NCBE") and if applicable, a non-refundable fee by **check** made payable to the NCBE, in the appropriate amount as indicated on the NCBE fee schedule.

I have read Rule I of the Supreme Court Rules for the Government of the Bar, which pertains to temporary admission to the practice of law in Ohio and sets forth the procedures to which I am subject. I understand that if I need to terminate my military spouse admission, I must contact the Office of Bar Admissions.
