


# L.A. County Inmate Population Report (2017)




**Total:** Total inmate population as of March 8<sup>th</sup> 2017.

**Sentence Status 3:** All L.A. County matters Adjudicated. Not Pretrial (i.e., not eligible for any type of pretrial release).

**Sentence Status 2:** Some L.A. County matters adjudicated with some remaining open. Mixed convicted and pretrial (i.e., Most likely not eligible for any type of pretrial release).

**Sentence Status 1:** No L.A. County matters adjudicated. Pure Pretrial.



**100K Bail:** Bail was set at \$100,000.00 or more. Bail set at this amount generally indicates the defendant is accused of a type of crime that would very likely preclude them from an own recognizance release.

**No Bail:** Defendant is not able to post bail due to a “no bail” status or bail being set at 0, which is the same practical effect as a no bail hold. Not eligible for any type of pretrial release.

**Holding Agency:** The defendant has a hold ascribed by some agency making them ineligible for any type of pretrial release.

**Remainder:** Status 1 inmates remaining after the above categories (100k Bail, no bail or holds) have been subtracted out. These inmates have a bail set at a level that would generally indicate a less severe crime making them eligible for pretrial release and do not have a hold placed on them by some agency. Some of these defendants may still be in custody due to advice of counsel for time served or other reasons. A study by the JFA Institute of the L.A. County jail populations in 2012 discovered that only 13% of the “pure” pretrial population was, in theory, eligible for pretrial release. This finding is corroborated by the current numbers in L.A. County jails where only 18% of Status 1 inmates (pure pretrial) are, in theory, eligible for pretrial release.
