#### **THE OHIO SPECIALIZED DOCKETS PRACTITIONER NETWORK**

With over 125 specialized dockets in operation throughout Ohio, the Supreme Court of Ohio, the Ohio Department of Alcohol and Drug Addiction Services and the Ohio Department of Mental Health have recognized the need for interaction among the professionals that staff these courts. ### VERDICT SPLIT ON OVI TASK FORCE

Trumbull and Mahoning counties ranked in the top 10 in Ohio for alcohol-related traffic stops between Jan. 1, 2008, and Nov. 30, 2009, helping to prompt the state to extend a \$72,000 grant to fund a local task force to fight the problem in 2010. But while many local communities are providing police officers to the task force, several others have decided against taking part, saying they believe taking officers away from their communities to combat OVI, or operating a vehicle while impaired, at county-wide checkpoints would not be beneficial to their communities. ### MAKE DRUG DATABASE A MANDATORY CHECK

While prescription drug abuses by high-profile Hollywood celebrities are the cases that most often grab headlines, it's also a growing problem here in Ohio. Deaths related to overdoses of prescription drugs have soared in Ohio by at least 280 percent in the past decade, up to 524 in 2008, the latest data available. Nationwide, about 7 million Americans are abusing prescription drugs, an 80 percent increase from 10 years ago, according to The Associated Press. [More...](#)

### MENTALLY ILL INMATES SUE OHIO PRISONS

Mentally ill prisoners in Ohio are more likely to get into trouble and end up back in prison after they are released because state officials turn them loose without the follow-up care they need, a federal lawsuit claimed Wednesday. The lawsuit, filed in U.S. District Court in Cincinnati, asked a judge to order the Ohio Department of Rehabilitation and Correction and the Ohio Department of Mental Health to provide the care necessary to help keep mentally ill offenders from returning to prison. Advocates for prisoners and the mentally ill said they are suing to help not only the released prisoners, but also the taxpayers who must pay tens of thousands of dollars a year to keep them locked up when they commit new crimes and are sent back to prison. The purpose of this program is to expand and enhance substance abuse treatment services in courts using the Juvenile Drug Court model in order to provide alcohol and drug treatment, recovery support services and program coordination to juvenile defendants/defenders. It is expected that up to 27 grants will be awarded for up to three years. The average annual award amount for each grantee is expected to be up to \$325,000. **WHO CAN APPLY:** SAMHSA/CSAT is restricting eligibility to existing individual Juvenile Drug Courts or their Tribal/State or local governmental proxies who may apply on their behalf. ### **FY 2010 JUSTICE AND MENTAL HEALTH COLLABORATION PROGRAM GRANTS**

**DEADLINE:** April 8, 2010, at 8:00 p.m. Eastern Standard Time

The U.S. Bureau of Justice Assistance (BJA) has released its fiscal year 2010 solicitation for [Justice and Mental Health Collaboration Program \(JMHCP\)](#) grant applications. The program was authorized by the Mentally Ill Offender Treatment and Crime Reduction Act of 2004 ([MIOTCRA](#)) and promotes coordination among criminal justice, juvenile justice, mental health, and substance abuse agencies.

Applicants should demonstrate a commitment to increasing public safety through innovative cross-system collaborations that improve responses to people with mental illnesses who come into contact with the criminal justice system. Eligible applicants are states, units of local government, American Indian tribes, and tribal organizations.

Three types of grants are available under this program:

- Planning (\$50,000 maximum award for 12 months)
- Planning and Implementation (\$250,000 maximum award for 30 months)
- Implementation and Expansion (\$200,000 maximum award for 24 months)

The Council of State Governments Justice Center, coordinator of the [Criminal Justice/Mental Health Consensus Project](#), has provided technical assistance on behalf of BJA for the JMHCP since 2006.
