MOTION AND PROCEDURAL RULINGS

2025-1177. State ex rel. Townsend v. Burnside.

In Procedendo. Sua sponte, it is ordered that within 14 days, relator shall submit a request for issuance of an additional summons at an alternative address or show cause why this case should not be dismissed for failure to perfect service.

2025-1237. Foster v. McGinty.

Miscellaneous case. Sua sponte, it is ordered that within 14 days, relator shall submit a request for issuance of an additional summons at an alternative address or show cause why this case should not be dismissed for failure to perfect service.

2025-1317. Lyon v. Riverside Methodist Hosp.

Franklin App. No. 23AP-379, **2025-Ohio-2991**. On motion for permission to appear pro hac vice of Cary Silverman. Motion granted. Pursuant to Gov.Bar R. XII(4), counsel shall file a notice of permission to appear pro hac vice with the Supreme Court's Office of Attorney Services within 30 days.

MISCELLANEOUS DISMISSALS

2025-0981. State v. Groh.

Defiance App. No. 4-24-21, **2025-Ohio-1497**. Appellant has not filed a memorandum in support of jurisdiction, due October 16, 2025, in compliance with the Rules of Practice of the Supreme Court of Ohio and therefore has failed to prosecute this cause with the requisite diligence. Cause dismissed.

2025-1124. State ex rel. Finnel v. Dept. of Rehab. & Corr.

In Mandamus. Relator did not file a response to this court's October 1, 2025 entry ordering relator to submit a request for issuance of an additional summons at an alternative address or show cause why this case should not be dismissed for failure to perfect service on respondent. Sua sponte, cause dismissed for failure to perfect service.

MEDIATION MATTERS

2025-1123. State ex rel. Hudson v. Cleveland.

Franklin App. No. 24AP-207, **2025-Ohio-2871**. The court returns this case to the regular docket under Rule 19.01. Appellant shall file a brief within 40 days, and the parties shall otherwise proceed in accordance with Section 16 of the Rules of Practice of the Supreme Court of Ohio. As provided in Rule 16.07, the court may dismiss this case or take other action if the parties fail to timely file merit briefs.
