RULES OF SUPERINTENDENCE FOR THE COURTS OF OHIO

RULE 36.019. Assignment of Cases Following a Recusal Disqualification.

(A) General

Following the recusal <u>disqualification</u> of a judge in a multi-judge court or division <u>of a</u> <u>court</u>, the administrative judge <u>of the court or division</u> shall randomly assign the case among the remaining judges of the court or division who are able to hear the case.
