He offers false advertisements.


He uses peers at malls, school events and parties.

He <u>is</u> her family.


Make her believe in heaven, and she will follow you to hell.






How does a trafficker <u>detain</u> women?

He gets her hooked on drugs.






He fathers her children.

And makes her his property.






The Path to Court



Common Charges

- Prostitution
- Drug possession and trafficking
- Theft
- Domestic violence (self defense)
- Operating a vehicle impaired
- Obstructing or resisting
- Domestic relations and child custody issues





That's why we must investigate every prostitution case like a human trafficking case.

But is that how she sees it?



She's unaware it's illegal.

She's ashamed. Embarrassed. Fears rejection.

MANIPULATED.

She's afraid for her life.

She thinks she loves her trafficker.



How should courts respond?

Don't be this guy.



Practice trauma-informed care



Trauma-informed care builds trust.

Treat her like a victim of violent crime.

Don't cast judgment.

Look her in the eyes and show concern.

Listen. Show her she is worthy.

Never promise what you can't deliver.

Keep her safety a priority.

Be consistent, transparent and flexible.

Be mindful of what you say in open court.

TRADITIONAL RESPONSE

What's wrong with you?

TRAUMA-INFORMED RESPONSE

What happened to you?

TRADITIONAL RESPONSE

You deserve punishment for your behavior.

TRAUMA-INFORMED RESPONSE I understand trauma led you to behave this way. TRADITIONAL RESPONSE

Rushing to identify criminals and victims.

TRAUMA-INFORMED RESPONSE

Understanding trauma reactions are expressed in different ways.

TRADITIONAL RESPONSE

You are in control of the circumstances that brought you here.

TRAUMA-INFORMED RESPONSE

Your behavior is understandable given your life experiences.

TRADITIONAL RESPONSE

You need removed from society.

TRAUMA-INFORMED RESPONSE

You need removed from your circumstances.


TRADITIONAL RESPONSE



Human trafficking devastates communities.

Most communities are **unprepared** to treat the multiple complex needs of this population.

Complex needs...

Alcohol and drug abuse

Dental health Medical care

Housing

Lack of marketable skills




\$5,451,313 Annually. **To do NOTHING.** Based on average of 1,000 women

That's... **\$2,315,071** For police (CPD)

That's... \$148,000 Municipal court judges, public defenders, prosecutors, clerks

That's... \$2,600,000 Jail (ADAMH 2006)



And those are just the measured costs.

Unmeasured Costs...

Prenatal, neonatal birth & delivery

Children Services

Failed drug treatment Guardianship & Juvenile Courts

Columbus Public Health costs of STDs Foster care (\$1,000/month/child) and adoption Neighborhood decline

Reduction in tax revenue

Decreased home values

CATCH Court costs...

\$375,000 Annually.








What can our community do?

Build systems to help women EXIT.

Provide survivors with treatment and support them in their transition.

Make your community a place where it is not profitable to <u>SELL</u> women and girls. Make your community a place where people no longer want to <u>BUY</u> women and girls.

What can I do?

Learn how to recognize and respond to trauma.

Recognizing a human trafficking victim

PHYSICAL OR EMOTIONAL CUES

Bruises or other injuries	Submissive or fearful behavior	Emotional distress
Inappropriately dressed	Signs of drug addiction	Withdrawn
Branding tattoos	Avoids making eye contact	Confusion, phobias, disorientation



Support trauma-informed recovery houses.

Talk to men about <u>not</u> supporting commercial sex. Seek ways to serve and protect women & other vulnerable populations.









OUR SPECIFIC POPULATION

- 98% Female
- 32% entered prostitution before age 15 (as young as 3 years old)
- 70% sexually abused as minor
- 50% have Traumatic Brain Injury
- 96% have been in jail or prison, an average of 11X
- 64% have a felony
- 62% have mental health issues
- 77% have been in treatment multiple times
- 83% have children
